**HUNT ROOSEVELT ELK and BLACK BEAR in BRITISH COLUMBIA**  
 (Cervus canadensis roosevelti)

**Roosevelt Elk** were reintroduced to the Sunshine Coast from Vancouver Island in 1987. The huge-bodied Elk often weigh in at over 1,000lbs. The highest scoring Elk for the 2010 season went 395 SCI. The biggest recorded Elk from our area scored 416 SCI. Coastal BC arguably has the largest population of black bears per square mile in North America. The mild climate provides the bears with a very long feeding season starting early in the spring and ending late in the fall on the salmon spawning rivers. Our area encompasses 4000 square miles on the southwest coast of BC. Much of the area is accessible only by boat or floatplane, making resident hunting pressure virtually non-existent. With abundant food and low hunting pressure, it's easy to see why coastal bears grow to such a large size. Bear hunting in the spring is done by boat cruising along the beaches and estuaries, or by 4 x 4, glassing the logged off areas in the mountains, where bears are feeding on the lush new vegetation. All hunts are exciting spot and stalk. The average bear taken squares over six feet although every year many go over seven feet and a high percentage of the skulls make the record books.



Fly into the Vancouver International Airport. If hunting out the northern camp, from there take a five minute taxi ride to the Sea Air Float Plane base and a scenic 35 minute flight to the Powell River camp. Flights can be arranged with [West Coast Air](#) and [Pacific Coastal Airlines](#).

If hunting in Southern portion of the guiding area, clients take a 5 minute taxi ride to the SEA Air Float plane base (next to the Flying Beaver restaurant). Flights can be arranged with [West Coast Air](#) or [Tofino Air](#). Enjoy a 35 minute float plane ride into camp.

**Price Excludes:** airfare, transportation to and from camp, cost of licenses and tags, firearms and ammunition, hotel expenses before and after hunt days, alcohol, personal belongings, special food, cost of medications, immunizations, hospitalizations and services of doctors, charges for evacuation or rescue by ambulance, helicopter or airplane and any other service or product that is not agreed or mentioned in this document.

**Reservations & Payments in U.S. Dollars only:** Confirmation will be upon receipt of a 50% deposit to hold the hunt dates. The balance to be paid upon arrival in US currency, cashiers or travelers checks. You must also read, understand and accept by signing the [Terms and Conditions](#), [Release of Liability](#) and the [Hunting Contract](#). Upon entry into the U.S. with a trophy, present to authorities your [Wildlife Declaration Form 3-177 \(Instructions\)](#) with 3 copies. All clients must comply with the U.S. Department of the Interior/Fish and Wildlife Services laws, requirements and conditions.

**Note:** Wounded un-retrieved animals are considered a kill. All hunts, license and tag fees are subject to 6% HST.



Camps are comfortable float houses with all the amenities: electric lights, hot showers and comfortable beds. There are a maximum of four hunters in camp at one time which ensures each hunter a relaxed, enjoyable stay. Fresh seafood such as prawns, crabs and oysters go well with the spectacular scenery at each camp.

**Suggested Equipment List:** one scoped rifle 300 caliber and or archery equipment, binoculars, layer clothing (light weight hunting pants and jacket), rain gear, water proof hat, water resistant boots, day pack, camera, sneakers for around camp and personal toiletry.
